1. Approval of Minutes of November 2018

The minutes of the 2018 meeting were approved unanimously.

2. Submissions

USA 3: PCS Scoring

The submission is not supported. The committee follows the arguments of ITC by believing that PCS data is sufficient. It was discussed if a "planing factor" just for information may be noted on the certificate, which was debated but not unanimously accepted.

3. Committee membership

The Management Committee has asked all Committee Chairman to nominate a Vice Chairman, and so Akis Tsalikis has been named Vice Chairman of the Committee, while with approval from Eva Drakenberg, Johan Tuvstedt (SWE) will replace her on the Committee.

4. Guidebook for Race Managers

The Committee noted that the idea for a Race Management Guidebook is now 2 years old, and is need of completion. After debate the plan will be to write a draft with thorough content suitable to all users of all experience levels.

After this a shorter Quick Guide will be written that can give topical overviews intended for the casual or new user who desires only simple scoring.

Zoran Grubisa and Dobbs Davis will deliver a draft at the ORC Staff meeting in mid-December, with help from Willem Ellemeet, Johan Tuvstedt and the Chairman.
