### The New York Yacht Club

The New York Yacht Club was founded in 1844 and has had a storied 178-year history. Racing sailboats has long been part of the DNA of the Club – the first Annual Regatta was run in 1846 and the 168th edition was successfully held in June of 2022. In 1851, John Cox Stevens, the first commodore of the NYYC, brought his yacht *America* to England and won the Royal Yacht Squadron's Hundred Guinea Cup which later became known as America's Cup. The NYYC defended that trophy from 1870 until 1983.

Today, the New York Yacht Club continues to lead the sailing community in many facets. In addition to annually hosting high level events in all disciplines, the club is instrumental in supporting both professional and Corinthian sailing. Whether it is through backing *American Magic*, the Club's challenger for the 36th and 37th America's Cup, its fleet of 20 IC37s, or the support of women in sailing with the Women's 2v2 Team Race and biennial Women's Championship, the New York Yacht Club is at the forefront of competitive sailing.



# Race Management

The New York Yacht Club Race Committee is the best in the business. Comprised of dedicated and skilled member volunteers, participation on the Race Committee is an honor at NYYC and excellence is assured.

The Club's race management resources are second to none and can accommodate any major regatta requirement. In addition to the club-owned fleet, which includes a signal boat, 28' Protector and 15 Ribcraft, we have access to a plethora of other support boats to fill in any event needs.

The Race Committee is supported by a Sailing Office comprised of three fulltime sailing professionals along with a Waterfront Department with two fulltime bosuns.





## Communications and Media

The New York Yacht Club boasts a fulltime Communications Department staffed with media professionals at the top of their game. Print coverage, race tracking, social media integration, leaderboards, announcing, and live streamed broadcasts with graphic overlays are just some of the ways events are covered here and shared with the worldwide sailing community.





Visiting media and photographers will find themselves well accommodated with organized access to the racing and a full-service media center.




# Sailing Venue

The primary race area is on Rhode Island Sound at the mouth of Narragansett Bay. This area provides an unobstructed race course in any wind direction with limited current impact.

A secondary race area is available north of the Newport Bridge on Narragansett Bay. This area offers more protected waters and is an ideal setting in certain wind conditions. Normal currents run up to a knot.

With the available sailing areas, a fleet of up to 160 boats divided into sections could easily be accommodated.

Typical weather conditions for Newport from June through September have temperatures between 72-85°F (22-29°C) with prevailing and reliable southwesterly breezes between 12-20 knots. Frontal passages may bring northwest or northeast breezes.



### Commitment to ORC

New York Yacht Club began the transition to ORC in 2018 and since 2021 has been using ORC as the only VPP handicap option in our regattas. The response has been strong with fleets of 49 and 43 boats respectively at the 167th and 168th Annual Regattas, 22 in the 2021 ORC East Coast Championships, and 23 in the 2022 Race Week at Newport presented by Rolex. NYYC has been a forerunner in building support for ORC among other leading clubs in the United States.



## Anticipated Entries and Countries

The United States boasts an active and quickly growing ORC fleet with over 900 certifications being issued in 2022. This foundation continues to strengthen and we anticipate strong participation at this event from local and visiting yachtsman throughout the United States and Canada.

We enjoy long-standing relationships with many leading clubs around the world and regularly see international representation each season at our standing and special events. Newport as a venue is on every serious sailor's bucket list. As host of the biennial Rolex NYYC Invitational Cup, the premier international Corinthian championship, our status as a world-class venue and destination continues to grow. Since the first edition in 2009, 41 yacht clubs from 21 countries have competed at this prestigious event.

Offshore World Championship, a full marketing effort will be deployed to encourage as much participation as possible from teams based both overseas and in North America.



### Rise of ORC in the United States

In addition to the New York Yacht Club, many other major clubs and races in the United States have embraced the ORC rule. Both the Chicago Yacht Club Race to Mackinac and the Bayview Mac Race, the two largest freshwater distances races in the United States, are now using ORC to score their performance divisions. Other events using ORC include Rolex Big Boat Series (St. Francis Yacht Club), Block Island Race Week (Storm Trysail Club) and events hosted by Annapolis Yacht Club.

# Logistics

#### **BOAT**

New York Yacht Club Harbour Court is located in Newport, RI. There are several major boatyards, sailmakers and chandleries in close proximity that can handle any size boat or repair.

Dockage and moorings are available throughout the area at a number of locations in Newport and the surrounding areas. Safe Harbor Marinas, Sail Newport and Oldport Marine will provide docking and services packages for the regatta competitors to help ease shoreside logistics.
